

The Kentucky Fair Health Care Financing Act of 1972, HB 100, is a landmark piece of legislation that established the Kentucky Fair Health Care Financing Board. The board was created to oversee the state's health care financing system, including the Kentucky Health Care Trust Fund, which provides funding for the state's health care programs.
