

On May 11, the Third Circuit Court of Appeals issued its decision in *Chirba v. Univ. of Pa.*, reversing a district court decision that had held that the Medicaid provisions of the Pennsylvania Constitution were unenforceable.

The court reviewed the Supreme Court's decision in *Wright v. Board of Directors of the State of New York*, 138 S.Ct. 1019 (2016), which held that the Medicaid provisions of the New York Constitution were enforceable.

The decision is extremely significant because it reverses a district court decision that had held that the Medicaid provisions of the Pennsylvania Constitution were unenforceable.
