## PLAINTIFF'S MOTION FOR PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION AND REQUEST FOR ORAL ARGUMENT

Pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65, Notre Dame hereby moves for preliminary injunctive relief, without bond, enjoining Defendants from continuing to require Notre Dame to provide coverage for contraceptives, abortion-inducing drugs, sterilization, and related counseling in its employee and student health plans.

A preliminary injunction is justified, as discussed in Notre Dame's accompanying Memorandum in Support, because (1) Notre Dame is reasonably likely to succeed on the merits of its claims; (2) Notre Dame is suffering a continuing, irreparable harm in the absence of preliminary relief that outweighs any harm the Government may suffer if the preliminary injunction is granted; (3) Notre Dame has no adequate remedy at law; and (4) an injunction

furthers the public interest. Accordingly, Notre Dame respectfully moves this Court to issue a preliminary injunction in the form of the Proposed Order that will be sent directly to chambers.

Notre Dame also requests oral argument on this motion, which involves important and complicated issues of constitutional and statutory law.
